Activities/Information:

On 09-02-2025, at approximately 1128 hours, deputies were dispatched to a residence on 16 Mile Rd near 190th Ave in reference to a domestic complaint. Dispatch advised that the complainant, a 24-year-old female, had contacted back and advised that she wanted to only file a report through Dispatch and did not want Officers. Deputies arrived and, after speaking to her, discovered the 25-year-old father of her child had assaulted her. He had subsequently left the area, going back to Grand Rapids, where he is from. Attempts were made to contact him, which were negative. A copy of the report was forwarded to the prosecutor's office to be reviewed on charges of domestic assault.

On 09-02-2025 at approximately 1144 hours, a deputy was dispatched to a business on Perry Ave near 215th Ave in reference to a fraud complaint. Dispatch advised that they had a fake \$100 bill. The deputy arrived on scene and made contact with the Assistant Manager, who advised that she had a clerk who had taken a \$100 bill from an unknown male. She stated that they found the bill in the register and noticed it was a fake \$100 bill. She advised that she reviewed the video and discovered that the male had gone to the gas pumps, had walked in, purchased a Monster energy drink and a few other items with

the \$100 bill, and received cash back. She was able to zoom in on the vehicle with the cameras and viewed the plate that was on it. The vehicle came back to a male who resides in Tustin. The deputy then requested an Osceola County deputy to go to that residence to see who had the vehicle. He advised that the person who had the vehicle was the 19-year-old son of the registered owner. Let it be noted that the young man's picture on SOS photo matched the photograph of the person who was in the store. The investigation remains open at this time.

On 09-03-2025 at approximately 1153 hours, deputies were dispatched to a piece of property on New Millpond Rd in reference to a warrant attempt. They arrived on scene and made contact with a 41-year-old female who had an outstanding warrant for being a probation absconder through the 49th Circuit Court. She was arrested for her outstanding warrant.

On 09-13-2025 at 2058 hours, a deputy was dispatched in reference to an assault that had reportedly occurred in the parking lot of a business on Perry Ave near 215th Ave. The caller called and stated that a male tried robbing him in the parking lot. The two had gone to school together. The deputy made contact with the complainant, who advised that the two had a conversation in the store, and that when exiting and getting to his car, the suspect, a 19-year-old male, was walking toward him with the tire iron, and they started talking, and he was trying to beat him up. He stated that he started to walk toward the store to get an employee, and the employee ended up walking him to his car and told the other male to put the tire iron away. He stated that after that, the male had then pushed him several times, and the employee had grabbed him and tackled him to the ground. The deputy watched the store video and observed this same behavior. He attempted to contact the suspect, who hung up on him. A warrant request has been submitted to the prosecutor's office for review for charges.

The MCSO took several calls regarding a 19-year-old mental in the area of Old Millpond and 15 Mile Rd over the past month.

On 09-14-2025 at 1801 hours, a deputy was dispatched to a business on Perry Ave near 215th Ave for the report of a retail fraud. The complainant advised that a male had stolen three to four beers, took them into the bathroom, and was drinking them. The deputy arrived on scene, made contact with the 37-year-old male, and wrote him an appearance ticket for Retail Fraud.

On 09-18-2025, at approximately 1227 hours, Dispatch received a call from a business on 220th Ave near 15 Mile Rd wanting to report a larceny complaint. The deputy arrived on scene, speaking to an employee, who advised that since August of 2025, someone has been stealing used rotors that they have placed behind their building on the southwest side. He was able to watch some video

and observed on 09-15-2025, at approximately 0103 hours, a black GMC Blazer or a GMC Jimmy was observed pulling up to the rotors. It appears that two subjects are in the vehicle, and only the passenger exits and loads up the rotors into the vehicle. It is unclear from the video if they are male or female. The deputy was advised that the same vehicle might be responsible for some larcenies at a business in Evart. Further investigation led to the identity of a 19-year-old male to be the suspect. The business did not wish to pursue charges but did want him trespasses.

On 09-18-2025 at 2310 hours, a deputy made a traffic stop on Perry Ave near Water tower Rd, which resulted in the 18-year-old male driver being given an appearance ticket for driving while unlicensed.

On 09-19-2025 at 0254 hours, a deputy was dispatched to the report of a PDA that had occurred on 13 Mile Rd near 210th Ave. The caller, later discovered to be a 16-year-old female, called and stated that she had rib pain, she was in an accident, and stated that she did not want the Police or an ambulance. She stated that she crashed her car again. She stated that she had driven into the ditch. When contact was made, she was found to be intoxicated. Her mother was contacted, arrived on scene, and took custody of her. A juvenile petition was filed with the prosecutor's office for OWI.

On 09-19-2025 at approximately 1906 hours, Central Dispatch received a phone call from the Store Manager of a business on Perry Ave near 215th Ave, advising that a male stole a couple of cans of beer. They did not know the male's name and advised that the suspect had taken off on foot, eastbound. Deputies then responded to the store and made contact with the Store Manager, who advised that he had recognized the male due to him being trespasses from the property by Deputy MARSHALL on the 14th. A warrant request was submitted to the prosecutor's office for the male for Retail Fraud. The male was later arrested on 09-25-2025 for attempting to steal alcohol again.

On 9-22-25 @ 1533, Deputies from the Mecosta County Sheriff's Office were dispatched to the intersection of 15 Mile Rd and 220th Ave in Big Rapids Twp for a two-vehicle accident. Investigation found that an 89-year-old male from Big Rapids was on 220th crossing 15 Mile Rd. and pulled out in front of a 20-year-old female from Big Rapids who was westbound. The collision resulted in the 89-year-old receiving fatal injuries. The female received non-life-threatening injuries and was transported to Butterworth Hospital in Grand Rapids. Deputies were assisted on scene by Big Rapids Fire/Rescue, Mecosta County EMS, Mecosta County Posse.

On 09-23-2025 at 2003 hours, a deputy was dispatched to an address on 16 Mile Rd near 190th Ave for a reported domestic assault. The caller, a 41-year-

old male, called and stated that he had argued with his 26-year-old girlfriend earlier in the day. She was hitting him with a toddler gate and threatening to kill him. He stated that he tried to leave, but she would not let him. He was eventually able to get past her and left for a while. The deputy investigated the complaint, speaking to the female half, who had left the scene, who denied anything physical had occurred. A copy of the report was forwarded to the prosecutor's office to be reviewed for charges against the female.

On 09-26-2025 at 0300 hours, a deputy arrested a 27-year-old male on an outstanding warrant at an address on 16 Mile Rd near 190th Ave.

On 09-30-2025 at approximately 2335 hours, deputies were dispatched to a domestic at an address on 185th Ave near 12 Mile Rd. The caller, 33 years old, stated that his father, 63 years old, punched him in the face. The caller stated that his father was in the living room, and they were in the bedroom. There are 2 firearms in the residence, one in the bedroom and one in the living room. No drinking or drugs. The caller stated he had restrained his father at one point to keep him from hitting him more. After investigating, the father was arrested for domestic assault.

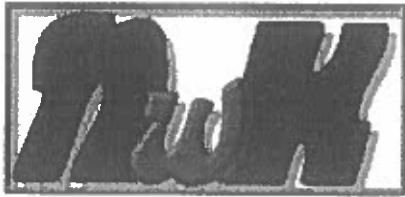

We had no major issues with only two call outs that required site visits other than our normal weekly inspections. Menards had an Auxiliary Float Alarm call out which only occurs as a last defense if normal level control fails. Upon arrival we found the Station in a normal operating state with no Auxiliary Float Alarm resets tripped, checked through system to verify, feel it was a glitch in the Missions/Controls, are continuing to monitor.

North State Street Station had some very strange daily readings for runtimes and GPM's, once on site we called Missions for remote access, ran system through its paces and determined that this also was a glitch in the Missions system so they were going to reboot the system and we will continue to monitor, and if this does not resolve the issue a new circuit board will be installed.

There were no Miss Diggs this month that needed site visits. Monthly report is attached for your review, all Stations are in good general condition and operating as designed at this time. We have replacement pumps ordered with a TBD delivery date.

SEPTEMBER 2025

All operations are normal at the plant. Well number 2 has been working great and producing plenty of water for the distribution system, the chlorine residual has been fluctuating between 0.4 and 0.6 mg/L or parts per million.

We got the sample results for the Haloacetic acids and Trihalomethanes samples I sent in. They both came back well within the safe limits required. I took a Partial Chemistry sample test from the cemetery that I am still waiting on the results for. I am also going to take a bacteriological sample from the cemetery as well as pump the hydrants down to get them all winterized in the next week or two.

The diesel fuel is approximately 2/3 full for the generator and the distribution pumps and motors are all working well.

V. SITE PLAN REVIEWS:

Pastor Paul Myers informed the Commission that the church has seen a 30% increase in attendance in just the past 9 months. They must park across 215th Avenue because they don't have enough space. Paul Henderson of Roosien & Associates advised that the project would be done in two phases, with phase 1 being the addition of parking to the current site and relocation of the south driveway. The driveway permit has already been obtained from the Mecosta County Road Commission. Phase 1 has no impact on regulated wetlands. The EGLE permitting process is delayed so the building phase will not start until that permit is issued. Mr. Everett asked if the project is in the Tonkin Drain District, which it is, and who will be monitoring the wetlands compliance during construction. Mr. Henderson stated EGLE would issue the wetlands permit and monitor the process. Mr. Montrose asked about the driveway location change. The reason for the change is to allow the driveway to line up with the service drive that will encircle the building. Mr. Henderson closed with the request that the entire project be approved with the building still needing EGLE permit approval. Mr.

Oliver motioned to approve the Site Plan for Res Life Church Phase 1 as presented and Phase 2 with EGLE permit approval. Second by Mr. Cook. No further discussion. Roll call vote as follows:

SYNOPSIS

This document is a summary of the economic development due diligence of the Mackinac Technology Company (MTC) and the owner, Mr. John Slagter (JS), conducted by me, Big Rapids Charter Township (BRCT) supervisor Bruce Borkovich, as authorized by the Big Rapids Charter Township Board. This synopsis includes intelligence gathering by me, interviews of John Slagter, and interviews of personal/professional references, and a list identified as **EXTERNAL DOCUMENTS**, which will be the documents that I used to prepare this report.

INFORMATION

The aforementioned economic development due diligence was deemed necessary as a result of the anticipated development of the Big Rapids Township Airport Industrial Park. This property consists of approximately 111 acres south of 18 Mile Road, east of the U.S. 131 Highway. This property is designated as "a district designed for light industry, to include manufacturing, assembling, and fabricating businesses, storage, information and technology and research development related businesses which may require suitable sites and isolation from any other types of land uses."

The objective of the Big Rapids Charter Township Board is to promote business growth in the BRCT Airport Industrial Park that is not a threat to the environment, and that is not a threat to the safety of the Mecosta County community; no threat to the physical safety, and no threat to the intellectual property of our citizens, nor any threat to national security interests.

The initiation and completion of this economic development due diligence is in no way a reflection of the reputation of the Mackinac Technology Company, or any specific concerns related to the company, or John Slagter. The BRCT Board, due to the particular sensitivities and public scrutiny regarding the proposed Gotion battery plant which was planned on property directly across 18 Mile Road from the BRCT Airport Industrial Park, insisted on this due diligence and transparency as the Industrial Park is developed. This due diligence has been determined by the Board to be in the best interest of transparency and representation of the residents of Big Rapids Charter Township.

INITIAL CONTACT WITH JOHN SLAGTER

I first was contacted by JS on May 22, 2025, when he left a phone message for me. When we talked that day, he described the factory that he was considering for the township Industrial Park. The proposed factory would produce window covers with a patented coating that greatly increased the energy efficiency of a window. JS had previously contracted with the U.S. Department of Defense and the Advanced Research Projects Agency-Energy to develop the window cover technology. They commissioned him to install these windows in a building renovation project they were undergoing. According to JS, the window covers proved to provide a significant energy savings. JS was considering a factory that was approximately 500,000 square feet, with the potential of employing up to 500 employees when it is fully operational. JS estimated that he would need approximately 50-100 acres for this project.

We set a time to meet on May 23, 2025, and Treasurer Marek and I showed JS the Industrial Park property. JS confirmed that the project would require approximately 50-100 acres.

On June 17, 2025, I met with JS, Green township supervisor Jason Kruse, and State Rep. Tom Kunse regarding support for the MTC project. On June 25th the BRCT held a special meeting, and JS presented a PowerPoint program describing MTC and the product that they would like to produce. The board subsequently supplied JS with a letter of support for the project. I have had numerous emails, phone calls, and texts exchanged with JS since our first conversation on May 22nd. During these contacts, I have found JS to be very professional, honest, open, and passionate regarding his proposed project. JS made it clear that at this time, he is seeking federal grant funding for the project, so it might be a "long shot."

Since May 22, 2025, I have had several in-person meetings with JS, and numerous phone calls, emails, and text messages, and I anticipate that this will continue.

When I informed JS that it was the desire of the Board to conduct an economic development due diligence regarding him and the MTC, he readily agreed to cooperate in any way necessary. I have asked a great deal of him in this process, and he has always been willing to meet in Big Rapids at short notice, and he has without exception been very prompt to answer phone calls, emails, and texts. When I explained the reason for and the nature of this due diligence, JS offered to prepare a notarized affidavit describing his business, and the assurance that the business would not be a threat to the safety/security of the Mecosta County community or national security. That affidavit is included in the **EXTERNAL DOCUMENTS** section of this report.

PERSONAL INFORMATION - JOHN THOMAS SLAGTER

John Thomas Slagter is the sole owner and shareholder of the Mackinac Technology Company. John Slagter (JS) was born and raised in Grand Rapids, MI. He graduated from Grand Rapids Christian High School, and attended Calvin College, and the University of Massachusetts. JS's family has been in the road construction business for many years, and JS also joined the family business.

A Michigan State Police criminal history check from the Criminal Justice Information Center showed that no criminal history exists for JS. No alias names exist for John Thomas Slagter. There were no known phone numbers for JS that were of any concern. Known past or present addresses for JS include Grand Rapids, MI, Wyoming, MI, Vicksburg, MS, and Rolling Fork, MS (where his factory/residence was). The properties that JS owns are all in or near Grand Rapids, MI. Known corporate and business associations are all in or near Grand Rapids, MI.

PERSONAL REFERENCES - JOHN SLAGTER

JS provided me with 5 personal references. One was the County District Attorney in Mississippi where the MTC factory was; another was the retired mayor of that town, who was also the former bank president. Another was the personal family attorney of JS and the Slagter family. The other two were administrators with the Michigan Small Business Development Center.

All 5 spoke of the passion that JS has for his project- a few described him as very bright or brilliant. He was also described as a persistent and tenacious businessman. All 5 spoke strongly describing the personal honesty and integrity of JS. All stated that they did not know of any connection between JS or the MTC and any Chinese entity. Quotes described JS as "a man of strong moral character", "an honest, stand-up guy", "all American guy", "beyond honest", and "no hint of dishonesty".

The former mayor stated that JS was passionate about opening a factory in a poverty-stricken area, and he further stated that JS had a great relationship with both the black and the white community in Mississippi where his factory was. The mayor also stated that JS worked very hard with local government officials, and he developed a very good relationship with them.

INTERVIEW JOHN SLAGTER- SELECTED MTC EMPLOYEES/TRAVEL TO CHINA

I interviewed JS regarding three employees that are listed as MTC employees, who may be nationals from the U.S. government countries of concern. The three employees in question were Jianwen Liu, David Tsu, and Marco Zhang. The following is a summary of this interview (see **EXTERNAL DOCUMENT 9**):

1. Jianwen Liu - he never did actually work for MTC - he worked for Mackinac GmbH, which is a German subsidiary company of the MTC. To the best of the knowledge of JS, Jianwen

did not speak English or Chinese- he was German born and spoke German. JS met Jianwen through his connection with Mackinac GmbH, but Jianwen no longer works for the German subsidiary company.

2. David Tsu - David is American born, and not a Chinese national. His father was from China, and his father's family was brutalized and imprisoned in China. His father immigrated to the U.S., and his father eventually became a U.S. diplomat under President Nixon. JS met David through his affiliation with the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers, and he has known David for approximately 20 years. David is a spectroscopist with MTC, and is from Detroit. JS advised that due to his family's terrible history in China, there is no way that David would spy for or have any connection to China.
3. Marco Zhang - Marco is a Chinese national, to the best of the knowledge of JS. JS hired him in 2015, and he was introduced to Marco by the U.S. Advanced Research Projects Agency - Energy, as part of a federal program that partners program awardees (MTC was an awardee) with scientists. Marco was a supply chain manager for the MTC factory in Mississippi until a tornado destroyed the factory. When the factory was destroyed, Marco left the MTC to work elsewhere.

I asked JS if he has ever made any trips to China, and if so for what purpose. JS traveled to China in 2018, when he was selected as part of a group of business owners to travel with then Governor Snyder; the trip was designed to develop export opportunities in China. JS advised that there was no Chinese interest in his company. During his time in China, he did not have any meetings or contacts with any Chinese officials outside of the scheduled itinerary with the governor's office. JS also noted that no Chinese officials or residents attempted any contact with him outside of the aforementioned itinerary.

JS advised me that to the best of his knowledge, MTC never employed any people from any of the countries of concern as defined by the U.S. government, other than Marco Zhang.

MACKINAC TECHNOLOGY COMPANY - FEDERAL NEXUS/PROJECTS

There have been six federally funded research projects to develop the MTC window technology- ranging from 2015 through 2024. Three of the six were through the U.S. Department of Defense, two through the Advanced Research Project Agency – Energy, and one through the U.S. Department of Energy. MTC performed demonstration installations at Selfridge Air National Guard Base in Michigan, and at the U.S. Air Force Academy in Colorado. These projects are further detailed in **EXTERNAL DOCUMENT 5**.

EXTERNAL DOCUMENTS 3, 4, and 7 document the agreements between the U.S. government and the MTC. After reading the documents and understanding the numerous projects between

the MTC and the U.S. government, it seems clear that the MTC has been thoroughly vetted as a safe company regarding national security.

MACKINAC TECHNOLOGY COMPANY- OWNERSHIP

The affidavit (**EXTERNAL DOCUMENT 9**) supplied by JS describes the history of MTC, and JS further establishes that he is the sole owner/shareholder of the company. JS assured that there has been no foreign ownership, influence, or control of the MTC, and no such attempt has been made by any foreign person or entity. Also, JS stated that at no time has there been any agreement to sell or any other promise or obligation made by the MTC to any foreign government, corporation, organization, or individual. **EXTERNAL DOCUMENT 6** further establishes that the MTC is solely owned and controlled by John Slagter.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

JS described himself as a person who is very concerned about the environment. He told me that his proposed factory would have a very minimal impact on the grounds. His process does not use toxic or dangerous chemicals; it does produce ozone, but the exhaust is directed to a filtration system which removes the ozone. He would not be importing or storing any hazardous materials. He advised that his factory would not pose any particular risks to responding emergency services if they were required.

The MTC manufacturing process does not use water- JS stated that the water needs of his factory would be the water necessary to use sinks and toilets, and general custodial care.

EXTERNAL DOCUMENT 3 and **4** describe the agreement between the MTC and the U.S. government regarding required compliance with numerous federal environmental protection laws. JS has demonstrated his compliance to these laws on numerous occasions.

Any building, including a private home, produces point source pollution. This is pollution from water runoff, disruption of existing soil structure/vegetation, chemical release from vehicles, fertilizers, cleaning products, etc. Based upon my training and experience, the proposed 500,000 square foot factory would produce the minimal amount of point source pollution that would be produced by any other building of similar size.

NATIONAL SECURITY/INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY CONCERNS

When I interviewed JS, I asked him what processes he had in place to protect the intellectual property of his company. JS advised that his unique process is patented in the U.S.; as a result of that, his "formula" can be easily be discovered by anyone. That is a part of the patent system. The patent protects his process from being copied for 20 years, with the remedy for patent infringement being a civil suit.

The U.S. is also part of an international patent treaty, which means that patent protection can extend to other countries around the world; he did however state that not all countries participate in this treaty.

As a former law enforcement official of 34 years, I do not recognize any threats that the MTC factory would pose to national security, or the security and safety of residents of Mecosta County. When forming this opinion, I relied heavily on several factors-

1. The personal references provided by JS. His references were established political, legal, and business officials who typically are reserved about who they support. Every reference repeated the strong integrity and honesty of JS.
2. The fact that the MTC has worked closely with the U.S. government, including projects on federal DOD properties, speaks volumes to me about the integrity of JS and the safety of the MTC. All of those projects underwent strict federal security scrutiny.
3. My personal impressions of JS, based upon many years in law enforcement and security, is that of a very straight-forward, honest person.

CONCLUSION

It is my conclusion that John Slagter and the Mackinac Technology Company pose no safety/security threats to local governments or the State or Federal government; and the factory as proposed, poses no significant threats to the environmental health or safety of the land and residents of Mecosta County. John has developed a seemingly revolutionary process that indicates to me that his innovation and the factories producing his product are likely to be a substantial success. Considering that the Big Rapids Charter Township Board, beginning in 1997, continuing through the current date, has secured and designated the 111 acres of the BRCT Airport Industrial Park for light industrial development, I feel we would be fortunate to have the factory proposed by John Slagter in our Industrial Park, to provide jobs and an economic boost that the residents of Mecosta County will benefit from.

WHEREAS, the Township Board determines that section (C) of Ordinance 150.020, requires more detailed permitted uses,

WHEREAS, the Township Board desires and intends to add the following permitted uses to the Ordinance language,

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF BIG RAPIDS ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. REPEAL OF SECTION 150.020, CHAPTER 150, TITLE XV: The Big Rapids Charter Township Code of Ordinances, Title XV, Chapter 150, Section 150.020 (C), is hereby rescinded and repealed, effective immediately.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 150, TITLE XV: The Big Rapids Charter Township Code of Ordinances, Title XV, Chapter 150, Section 150.020 (C), is amended to state:

Section 150.020 (C)

INDUSTRIAL PARK

Intent- a district designed for light industry, to include manufacturing, assembling and fabricating businesses, storage, information and technology and research and development related businesses, and other non-agricultural light industry/commercial activities which may require suitable sites and isolation from any other types of land uses.

Permitted uses:

- A. Manufacturing, compounding, processing, packaging, assembling, and fabrication operations;
- B. Research and experimental testing;
- C. Building/other material research, experimental or testing laboratories;

- D. Tool and die operations;
- E. Warehousing;
- F. Laboratories/operations for scientific, technical, and product development;
- G. Recycling centers;
- H. Office and administrative space;
- I. Centers/facilities for processing and managing computer/communication data;
- J. Distribution centers
- K. Any use above, which emits or creates noise, smoke, odors, dust, dirt, gases, glare, heat or vibration beyond the boundary of the premises.

The **fire hall** renovation is now complete, and it looks great. Chief has cleaned out 3 of the offices so that they can begin having staff come over to begin some training. Our administrative assistants will assist with shredding of old unnecessary documents.

We are not renewing our contract with **TextMyGov**. We have loved the service, but our new phone providers believe we can utilize their service for roughly 1/8th of the cost of what we currently pay textmygov. We are going to try and see if it will suffice, to save some money. We can always resume textmygov if anyone is unsatisfied.

There is a newly installed **official ballot box**! The BOE recommended this at a conference I went to recently, as it is paid for by the State and installation is reimbursed. This will be solely for ballots, as it is supposed to be. They relocated our regular tax collection and other forms box to the left side of the door. Both are ADA compliant and look great.
